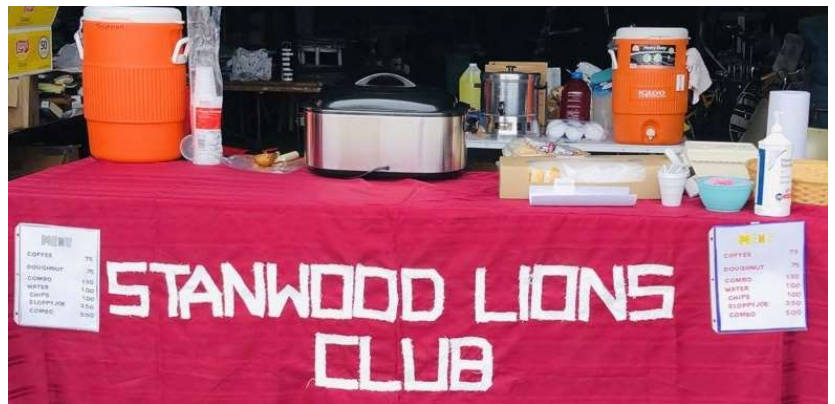

I will be introducing a proposal to make the District 11E1 Eyeglass Mission trip a District Project. It will be presented at the Convention. Aside from that, we are looking into a location for this next year's trip. Many exciting things to think about!!

Leader Dogs for the Blind has promised to prioritize the health and safety of their clients, volunteers, staff, and dogs. With this in mind they have made the following updates:

Guide dog and O & M training will be offered only in home environments at this time. The April (21-09) class has been cancelled. The O & M class scheduled to come has been postponed. They plan to conduct seven guide dog deliveries over the coming weeks.

Summer Experience Camp will be fully virtual again this year. Teens 14 - 17 years old in the U.S. and Canada will explore mobility options like guide dog travel, building leadership skills, and developing relationships with peers. Virtual summer Experience Camp will take place June 21-25.

This year Leader Dogs has been operating on a reduced client to instructor ratio of 2 - 1. They have made the decision to maintain a reduced 3 - 1 ratio moving forward into the next fiscal year, 2021 - 2022 compared to their traditional 4 - 1 model. In order to make this change all classes will be 3 weeks. Each team is being made smaller allowing each team to train a smaller number of dogs and a smaller number of clients. They will still serve the same number of clients annually but will do so with smaller classes that occur more frequently.

My Shadow-Cowboy-Update

Cowboy and I go to the gym 3 days a week. He picks up my cane, gives me his leash, and carries my water bottle for me. He is learning to alert me with a nudge on my leg when someone calls out my name. Cowboy now attends Lions meetings and even paid fines for getting his name and picture in the local newspaper! Training is nearly done; only one more session is planned. I will need to learn about the "intruder alert".

After this Cowboy and I will be on our own for 30 days to practice before the "final test" which will be videotaped. This is the final step before certification as a team! We are scheduled to do a PAWS

presentation for the Coleman Lions on May 3.
