As of this day, our annual Forum has been cancelled and we are trying to get it set up as a virtual meeting. We will keep you posted. We will be conducting our annual District Convention at the Evergreen Resort in Cadillac (April 22 - 23, 2022) and encourage all members to try to attend. This date is pending any unforeseen problems with COVID. We have an International speaker scheduled from Minnesota, PID Bruce Beck, in addition to our regular agenda, so please try to attend.

Your Council of Governors continues to conduct zoom meetings at least twice monthly and the following activities are being planned: Council of Governors meetings will continue, a Special Olympics program will be forthcoming in Detroit (we will keep you informed), and we have a Targeted Social Media Webinar for Sunday March 13, 2022 at 4:00 PM. It was decided to have a "60 Members in 60 Days New Member Campaign" that will last from April 1 to May 13. A new Certificate of Honor has been developed for members that have passed and will be sent to surviving family members. This will be incorporated at our annual convention in April. A training planned for 1VDG's will be forthcoming.

It is to be given by the current Governor, who may select as many recipients as he/she likes, and at the time and place of their choosing. Candidates must meet the following criteria—the recipient will have served actively in some district level capacity for a minimum of 2 years. The recipient must meet one of the following criteria:

- A. Has performed a special act of kindness or service that has had a positive impact on fellow Lions.
- B. Has made a positive impact through activities designed to address the needs of individuals, families, and/or the community.
- C. Builds the morale and inspires others through their actions.
- D. The recipient demonstrates sincere cooperation, positive attitude, and exceptional willingness to assist others.

We will also be awarding certificates from our International President Douglas X. Alexander.

As I write this the new year is just upon us. I have spent my first six months as a vice district governor. I never thought of myself as the leadership type and I approached this position with more than a little apprehension. If someone were to ask me to describe myself, I would have said, "In over my head!" Six months into this, I have been amazed and heartened by the excellent help and good advice I am getting. I am beginning to think that maybe, just maybe, I might be able to pull this off.

And that is the point of my message this month. Many of us shy away from positions of leadership because we feel we aren't up to the task. It's also a lot more comfortable being a follower - that way all eyes are not on you. Besides that, leaders have to stand up in front and talk to everyone - like a speech or something. Yikes!

There are lots of reasons why we avoid being a leader. I'm very familiar with all of them. All of these...fears?...keep us from taking an active role in deciding the direction of our club. By avoiding even a small leadership role we deny our club access to our imagination, creativity, uniqueness and passion for serving. It is a loss that shouldn't happen.

In my seventy-five years I have been around the block a time or two. And I tell you with complete honesty, I have never...ever...been exposed to an organization that takes training leaders as seriously as Lions International and the Lions of Michigan do. These are not organizations that teach swimming by dropping you into a pool of hungry sharks. They recognize that most of us have little leadership experience and approach training most appropriately.

There are workshops, seminars, podcasts, online courses, books, PowerPoint presentations, in person coursework and on-and-on. Many of these resources can be accessed via computer from your own comfy chair at home. Most take less than an hour of your time to go through.

When you are asked to serve in some capacity (and you will be) challenge yourself to accept a leadership role. It's OK to start small - be on the board, become a committee chair - take a risk. Then take advantage of the free training available to you. Don't know where to start? And don't be afraid to ask for help. Help is readily available from leaders and former leaders in your own club. I'm the first to recognize that I'm not the "brightest bulb on the string" so I make up for my lack of brilliance by asking a lot of questions. Go ahead, ask, it's OK!

Grow into that first position and when asked again, take the next step up. I guarantee your life will change for the better and your club will be the better for your efforts. I'm writing the next line in all capital letters: NO ONE WANTS YOU TO FAIL! Putting it another way: EVERYONE WANTS YOU TO SUCCEED! With that kind of support, how can you not?

Lion Bill Wilder has been a Lion for fifty-seven years. He joined the Pinconning Lions in 1965. In 1969, he moved to Evart, Michigan and joined the Evart Lions Club. Bill has been one of their most active members. He has been King Lion three times and the Evart Club's treasurer for the last approximately twenty years.

The Lions have run a food stand at the Evart Fairgrounds since 1947, when the Fairgrounds was first built. They spend about twenty days a year running the food stand and Bill has been an active participant in running the stand. For the last 7-8 years, Bill has been the chief grocery getter for the food stand. He travels out of town to Sam's Club and Gordon Foods to buy the food that the Lions sell. Bill has participated in all the activities that the club runs - two chicken Bar B.Q.s, White Cane, and one of their biggest fundraisers; they sell Michigan Lions Service Foundation Sight and Hearing raffle tickets and receive a rebate for tickets sold. Lion Bill was also instrumental in helping the Evart Lions start a scholarship program that awards a \$1,000 scholarship to a student each year and provides \$1,000 to the Promise Club that helps students find funding for college. Lion Bill is an Air Force veteran and a retired educator. He was a school principal for 20 years. Bill is active with several Masonic organizations, the area food pantry, and is a library volunteer. Bill indicated, "I have had a good life. It makes me feel good to make someone else's a little better."
