2nd VDG Jim Patterson's Message



One of my guiding principles has always been a phrase I thought Harry Truman said first. "Give 'Em Hell" Harry always had something pithy to say. Probably his most famous is "*The buck stops here*". But the one I'm talking about is "*It is amazing what you can accomplish if you do not care who gets the credit.*" Much to my surprise Truman wasn't the first to say this. A Jesuit Priest named Father Strickland deserves primary credit for a form of this saying as early as 1863. So the idea has a long history and even though Truman didn't coin the phrase I still regard it as one of the basic tenets of my personal code.

If you think about it a bit, that's true in almost every human endeavor. There are those for whom the spotlight shines and those who labor in the shadows. Take a football team for example. It is the quarterback, the wide receiver or the running back that gets interviewed. Do you ever see an offensive lineman on TV after the game? But if that lineman doesn't do the job, those "heroes" are pounded into the dirt. The question becomes: What motivates the lineman to do his job even though he gets none of the credit? I believe their motivation comes from a number of things; a belief in a shared outcome, the desire to do a good job, and the satisfaction of having done that job well. Being a Lion is pretty much that way. Lions are motivated by a desire to "give back" or help others - that's our shared outcome. We wouldn't dream of having a "brag" wall and we are always embarrassed when singled out for recognition.

I attended my very first MD-11 Council of Governors meeting a couple of weekends ago. Nearly all the Lions I met there spend a good deal of their own time and money to accomplish the goals of Lionism. As a Lion you well know that a lot gets done "on our own dime" but I was really set back on my heels to discover the amazing amount of time Lions at that level spend on Lionism. What dedication! They weren't bragging - it just became apparent through the conversations. The next time you participate in a club project stop for a moment and ponder the time your committee chair spent in organizing that project. You'll be amazed as well. Sure, we have our Lautzenheiser Fellowships and such. After all, it is nice to hear a thank you once in a while. But those things aren't what drive us. Hardly anyone becomes a Lion just to fluff up their resume.

So I say to all Lions, everywhere, that even if you never hear a "thank you" your efforts are not wasted. You do not labor in obscurity to no good end. You accomplish amazing things! Lives are made better; people are healed through your efforts! And you don't care who gets the credit. I am proud to be one of you.

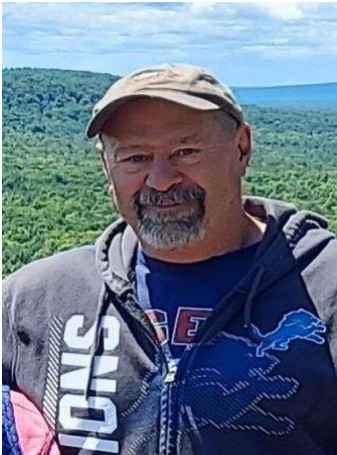

LIONS OF MICHIGAN SERVICE FOUNDATION

Trustee Pete Conarty is in his sixth year as a trustee and the Foundation constitution only allows a trustee to serve three, two-year terms. A trustee will be elected at the District Convention in April to replace Pete next year.

Hearing Aid applications must be reviewed and signed by one of these Lions before being submitted to the Foundation. The number of requests is down because many applicants can now receive their aids through their insurance. The District has submitted approximately 10 applications so far this year.

Obituary for Lion John Francis Paro



John Francis Paro (78), resident of Kingsley, MI died August 20, 2021 at Munson Medical Center, Traverse City MI. John was born January 4, 1943 to Ivan Clyde and Patricia Em (Dudley) in Mesa, AZ, and grew up in San Bernardino, CA. During his younger years, he was very involved in Boy



Scouts, which helped him to discover his love of the great outdoors. During John's high school senior year, the family moved to Dayton, MT, where he met his future wife, Cleora (Cleo) Hawkins. They were married in Coeur d'Alene, ID June 8, 1965. John graduated from University of Montana with a Forestry Degree that prepared him for his 30+ year career with the National Park Service as a Park Ranger and Administrator. He lived and worked in places that many people only dream about and put on their bucket lists: Grand Canyon National Park (AZ), Glacier National Park (MT), Grand Teton National Park (WY), Chesapeake & Ohio Canal National Park (MD), Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore (MI) and Gateway Arch National Park (MO).

John and Cleora (Cleo) retired to Northern Michigan where he enjoyed many years of hunting, fishing and exploring the United States with friends and family. He was active in a NARFE Chapter. He was a member of the Empire Lions Club before becoming an active in the Kingsley Lions Club in 2015, in which he held the office of President, Vice President, and was currently Club Treasurer. He was also Michigan Lions District II-E1, Zone 1 Chair for the last 2 years.

He is survived by his wife (Cleora), sister-in-law (Nora), son (Brian), daughter (Lynnette/Larry Shuman), granddaughter (Sydney/Patrick Shults) and grandson (Spenser).

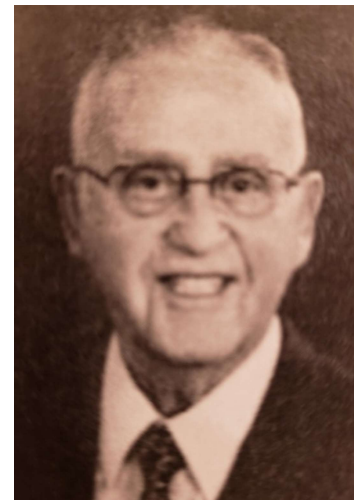
This is from John's family: He passed away on August 20 after a very sudden onset of liver and kidney failure. The doctors were unable to find a reason for this acute illness. John entered the hospital July 23 and began dialysis the following week. At one point he rallied and entered the inpatient rehab unit at Munson but John was extremely exhausted and made the decision to pass pain free and with dignity. He made that decision on Aug 18 and entered Palliative/Comfort Care on the morning of Aug 19. He was able to talk with family and friends to say their last good byes and share a few laughs. His passing has left a giant hole in our world but we have a lot of good memories. Those will help us all to move forward and live life like he would want us to.

He has been a Lion for 38 years and served as District Governor in 2014-15. Andy Watson was a Lion for 49 years and served as District Governor in 1986-87. He helped organize the Michigan Eye Bank and build the Michigan Lions Service Foundation.



Lion Pete has served in all levels and activities of his home club, the District, and the state. Including doing the newsletters, serving on committees, Zone Chair, Global Membership District Coordinator, Global Leadership District Coordinator, Lions of Michigan Foundation, for example. Lion Andy also served in all levels and activities of his home club, the District, and the state especially the Eye Bank (Eversight) and Lions of Michigan Foundation. They both lived and breathed Lionism. Both men were also very active in their chosen careers, churches, and community. Lion Pete was a teacher/administrator in the Midland Public School system. Lion Andy worked for Dow Chemical for 36 years in their Agricultural Department.

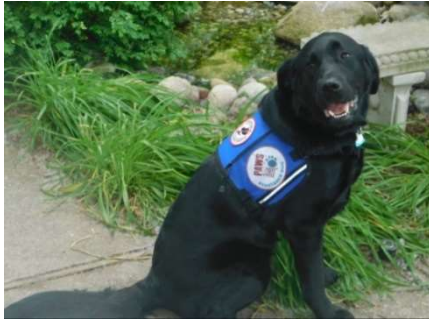
A PAWSome New Event! *Retriever Fever*

6. On the day of the event, proudly wear your Lions apparel and some type of apron to hold the candy and any information to be distributed. Nail aprons work well.

1. Count and deposit all money collected and make a complete report to the club at the next scheduled meeting.
2. Thank each member who helped and the local merchants that provided space for the solicitation.
3. Thank the community for their support in a follow-up article in the local paper.
