Dear Fellow Lions,

The essence of Lionism is service, especially service to youth, to people with vision and hearing difficulties, and to victims of disasters. One of our important district programs helping youth is KidSight, a screening program to identify children with correctable vision problems. Many of our clubs have held KidSight screenings and many children with problems have been identified and helped. Currently, an experienced Lion brings the camera and the local club arranges for the children to be screened. The experienced Lion is needed because taking the pictures requires practice in taking them and in deciding whether the eyes are shown correctly. The camera has to be held just right and any errors require taking another picture. The pictures are taken in a relatively dark room and the resulting film sent to Detroit for reading by an eye doctor. If an abnormality is detected, the parents are sent a notice and requested to visit an eye care provider. Clubs pay for the film and a fee for reading the film, about \$4 per child. To test 100 children costs local Lions Clubs \$400. In addition to the cost, the system has two limitations: one is the availability of film; the other is the delay between screening and notification of the parents. The film problem is becoming especially critical because the company that made the film has gone out of business and no one has stepped up to make the film in their place.

A few months ago I wrote to you about a replacement system for the film camera. Currently, the camera detects only strabismus, a condition in which the eyes are not aligned. Although this problem is very serious because if left untreated it can lead to loss of 3 D vision, it is relatively uncommon; it occurs in about 4% of the population. The replacement system, a PediaVision System, detects not only strabismus, but also focusing problems like nearsightedness and farsightedness, as well as other vision problems. The system requires an operator and a computer entry person. The operator can learn to use the device in five minutes, because the system will not take the picture and do the screening until the device is lined up correctly. When it is, it lets the operator know and a digital picture is taken. The device then does the screening automatically. The system detects the problems immediately so that there is no delay in notifying the parents. The parents can then take action by bringing the child to an eye care specialist to solve the problem. The new system solves the film problem because it does not use film. Instead it takes a digital picture that is kept only a short time, and it reads the picture and other information from the child's eyes electronically and prints out the results for the parents. The cost of consumables per child includes the cost of a piece of paper with the report and the cost of an envelope to put the report in, if needed, a few cents. What does cost a lot is the PediaVision device itself, \$10,000 per device.

Because our clubs do not have an extra \$10,000 lying around, we plan to apply for a grant from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) to help pay for the PediaVision Systems. LCIF will pay for half if we can raise the other half first. If we can raise \$5,000, we can get \$5,000 from LCIF and get a PediaVision System. If we can raise \$10,000, we can get two of them. If we can raise \$15,000, we can get three, and three should be enough to supply clubs throughout the district with the system when they need it. There are many children in the district; my hope is that we can screen them all to save vision for as many as possible. If we can average \$10 per Lion in the district, we can get three PediaVision systems. At your next board meeting, please ask your club to consider pledging toward raising the money to apply for the grant to buy three PediaVision Systems. Please notify Governor Laura about your club pledge. It would be great if we could hear from all the clubs by the District Convention on April 1.

Alas, I have a weight gain from being sedentary to take off again. Overnight sugar levels are still beyond my goal and continue to adjust the insulin. My blood pressure is great. I'm off two medications that were related to the surgery. Anti-rejection medication dosages haven't changed since the first part of November. I'm being sent back to my nephrologist in Big Rapids next week. After that I have an appointment at the transplant center for May 9<sup>th</sup>. If all blood work remains stable, I'll only need to go to the transplant center every 6 months for 2 years. My skin color is not "ashen", but has returned to normal.

In addition, we have a very special opportunity to have Kim Wattles and her two special friends, Aberdeen and True, joining us on Monday nights in the near future. Aberdeen (on the left) is Kim's Therapy Dog and a Retired Leader Dog Mom who helps her do Leader Dog presentations in schools, for the Lions Clubs and any other



organizations that need them. On her birthday, Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> "Abby" will be 5 years old. True (on the right) was a puppy program raised pup, which means Kim got her when she was a pup and raised her until she was 13 months old, then turned her back to the school for her formal training as a Leader Dog. Everything about her was perfect to be breeding mom so after a month in a half True was pulled to be a breeder for Leader Dog. She had one litter of 4 pups and when she was bred again she got an infection and had to be spayed. So she is now Kim's pet dog...but another Retired Leader Dog Mom who travels with Kim for Therapy work and Leader Dog presentations. True will be 3 on March 20<sup>th</sup>.

It is our hope that children and adults who are grieving will be able to connect with Aberdeen, True and Kim as an additional source of comfort and support. Both Aberdeen and True are friendly, "mellow" dogs who have been trained not to jump on or bark at others. As Kim shared "They are both very loving black labs who love to have their bellies rubbed and just be loved up."

Kim is hoping to begin bringing the dogs on March 14. However, as we work to make our new Family Support Center a warm, nurturing, healing environment for all who are grieving, we are proceeding with caution to make sure our group members, adults and children alike, are comfortable with the prospect of having these dogs at our meetings. If anyone has issues with dogs, or suffers from allergies to dog dander, **PLEASE** talk to me about these concerns. We don't want anyone to feel they can't attend group meetings because the dogs are there. Our primary goal is to aid in your healing, not interfere with it. Please let me know if you have any concerns whatsoever.
