



## **DISTRICT GOVERNOR JIM PATTERSON'S MESSAGE**

Fellow Lions,

Last month I wrote about the critical lack of leadership at the district level. Lion Steve A, the chair of our Nominations and Elections committee, made an outstanding suggestion; invite Past International Director Justin Faber to speak to our cabinet. PID Justin came loaded with insight and suggestions. He led us to several possible solutions and pointed out the advantages and disadvantages of each in a most calming and friendly manner. He helped us see a way forward.

PID Justin's positivity and encouragement provided the incentive for one of our own to step up and agree to serve as our current First Vice District Governor for the remainder of this year and to be District Governor next membership year. By the time you read this, a special election will have been held and Lion Tom MacNaughton, our current Lions of Michigan All-State Band chair, will be elected to the position of First Vice.

But this isn't a cheery, crisis averted, breathe a sigh of relief kind of situation. All we've really done is kicked the can down the road until this time next year. If we don't change our ways, we will soon be in crisis mode again. PID Justin's long-term solution is to step up our recruiting and training efforts. Competent district leadership is an absolute necessity. To that end, our Global Leadership Team Chair, PCC Jeff S of the Coleman Lions, is working hard to put together a training program that is both relevant and insightful.

We are also applying to Lions International to have a Coordinating Lion assigned to help us get back on track. A Coordinating Lion is often, but not always, a Past International Director with extensive organizational experience. They will guide us to reorganize and redouble our efforts to be the greatest Lions District we can be.

If you know or run into Lion Tom, be sure to thank him for his dedication and energy. He is assuming the monumental task of absorbing two full years of training in the space of a few months - not the easiest thing to accomplish.

Let me say this one more time, competent leadership is an absolute necessity for success. Our district has many ways to help clubs serve better. But we can't do that if we are always scrambling for leadership. We are searching for Second Vice District Governor candidates for the remainder of this year and one for the next. Lack of experience and apprehension are the big reasons good Lions never take the big step. The training available to you as Second and First Vice is considerable and excellent. Every previous leader is willing to help you succeed. No one wants you to fail. What's holding you back?

## CONVENTION SERVICE PROJECT

I hope you and your members will be able to attend the District Convention in Mt. Pleasant on April 19th & 20th. It's always good to come together, share issues, bounce around ideas, meet new friends and old from around our district and conduct district business! You all are important to District 11E1.

I am working on plans for the District Service Project and can use your help! DG Jim Patterson and I thought that putting together **personal hygiene bags** for the homeless in our area was a good goal this year. Using district funds, I will purchase toothbrushes and toothpaste, nail clippers, combs, lip balm and lotion. But before I do that, I thought I should ask if you or a club member has a source who might donate some of the mentioned items? That would free up funds to purchase other items.

With help from members, we will be able to assemble 200 bags. A few sit-down jobs will be available, but the most help will be needed walking around tables and filling bags with items we have available. Lions will be invited to take bags back to their community's shelters. Any remaining will stay in Mt. Pleasant for our host club to distribute.

If your club would like to purchase/bring something for the kits, everything will be used! Perhaps some Lions have a collection of travel size soap, hand sanitizer, toothpaste, or lotion that they can contribute. Here is a list of other items of varying cost (Amazon). Let me know if you plan to buy/bring something for the bags. Together we can make this an awesome service project, helping 200 less fortunate. **ARTICLE VII, SECTION 2** of the District 11E1 Constitution and By-Laws: **CLUB DELEGATE FORMULA**. Each chartered club in good standing in Lions Clubs International and its district shall be entitled in each annual convention of its district to one(1) delegate and one(1) alternate for each ten(10) members, who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club, or major fraction thereof, of said club as shown by the records of the international office on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the convention is held(March 1, 2023). The major fraction referred to in this section shall be five(5) or more members. Further, full delegate status shall be accorded each Past District Governor who is a member of a Club in this District, independent of the Club delegate quotas herein above specified. Each certified delegate present in person shall be entitled to cast one(1) vote only for each office to be filled by, and one(1) vote only on each question submitted to, the respective convention. Unless otherwise specified herein, the affirmative vote of a majority of delegates voting on any question shall be the act of the convention. All eligible delegates must be members in good standing of a club in good standing in this district. Delinquent dues may be paid and good standing acquired up to fifteen(15) days prior to the close of credential certification (12 noon, Saturday, April 20, 2024)

[Lion Will Greeley, our most recent Lions member, wanted to share a very positive experience he had recently while attending the Rose Bowl in Pasadena.]

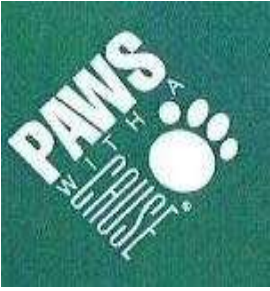
