



DISTRICT GOVERNOR JIM PATTERSON'S MESSAGE

After I retired from teaching, my wife and I started a party-rental business from scratch. You know, a place where you can rent tents, tables, chairs, and a margarita machine. As a reasonably well-educated couple, we thought we had a pretty good handle on the situation. Boy! Were! We! Wrong! Retail is a cruel business and we were nearly bankrupt in less than six months. Luckily, we were quick learners and had some good mentors. We got our feet under us and never looked back. The business grew at a steady pace as we became more and more comfortable in that role. Eventually we sold the whole shebang.

So, what does this have to do with Lions?

The big thing I learned from my eight-year retail career is: You **MUST** advertise. Getting the public to see your message means you smack them in the face with it - right between the eyes - over and over and over. Advertising is something that Lions Clubs everywhere just don't do well - if at all. We're secretly proud of being the "best kept secret in town." It just doesn't seem to be in our DNA - and it needs to be. To attract attention and interest, clubs must advertise well.

This time I want to talk about one aspect of advertising: signs.

In today's over-hyped world, everyone is battered from every direction with media demanding attention. With everyone clamoring at every turn for attention, the way to get noticed is to go big - and BIGGER - loud - and LOUDER! Along with this, the message has become simple and simpler. Kentucky Fried Chicken has been KFC for years now. Burger King no longer says "Have it your way." Instead, they shout, "You Rule!"

There are lessons here for all Lions Clubs. And we've heard them before: Go Big or Go Home. Keep It Simple Stupid. Loud And Proud.

Large, professionally prepared, signage is paramount to getting recognized as the pros we are and getting our message across. Homemade signs spell A M A T E U R! Not Serious! Plus, the message must be simple. BIG SIGNS with FEW WORDS are what works.

- A little 3x5 ad in the local shopper's guide - won't register.
- A hand lettered poster board propped up on a folding table - ignored.
- "World's largest service organization..." spiel - blah!

Go ahead, smack them in the chops with "Lions Clubs Help People In Need" or "We Serve" or "Together We Can Change The World." Yes, that costs money but a smart club will budget for signage and then take good care of them so they can be reused at multiple events. A clear, simple message will generate interest and when they ask.... **you've got 'em.**

If your club has more than \$50,000 in annual gross receipts, the club needs to file the IRS Form 990 or 990-EZ. The e-postcard 990-N is due by November 15 due to the Lions fiscal year.
