Introducing Lions, USA

When we meet Lions from other countries, they are the Lions of Germany, Lions of Japan, etc. Previously, here in the United States, we have been the Lions of Michigan, Lions of Iowa, etc. We are now going to be the Lions USA and their affiliates.

Why? Lions in the other 199 countries have programs on a country level that help promote Lions Clubs. We have not but with the Lions USA we will. Our first nationwide event, Ever Sight, is scheduled from January 12 -19. If your club participates in Ever Sight, I am encouraging you to plan an Ever Sight screening session between January 12 and 19. If you don't do Ever Sight please plan a sight related project, maybe collecting glasses, etc. The Lions USA will also provide help to clubs as they get organized like the other countries do. This is so we can be productive and be recognized as the premier organization in our community.

Best Kept Secret

The best kept secret is Lions Clubs. What do they do? I often get asked this question. Make sure you advertise all you do in the community. Put what you do on electronic media, put it in the local paper if you still have one. Tell them when you meet, where you meet, if you are having a party for your members or the community.

Mention what you are doing or have done for the community, like helped with Kid Sight, helped a family, provided eyeglasses, hearing aids, diabetes or any one of the other wonderful things we do as Lions. Get your article in the newsletter or Lions Pride, your ideas may be used by other clubs and may be tweeted around the world.

Be sure to get on the Lions Portal and list all the things your club does and donates to. The UP just reached 100% reporting if they can do it so can we in District 11 E1. We get credit for all we report to Lion Clubs International.

Lions All State Band

We currently have 33 members in the Lions All State Band. I am hoping for 15 from our 11 E1 district alone. We presently have less. Please let your local Band Director(s) know about Lions of Michigan All State Band. If you need information on the band contact Lion Bert MacNaughton. He is in the Roster Book and is our district Band Chair.

The deadline for auditioning has been extended to January 17. It will cost from \$3,200 to \$3,500 dollars for each band member. Please help support these students as they come to clubs looking for sponsors. It will take many clubs to make this a success. If the student received a 1st division rating on their solo at the MSBOA festival they are automatically accepted into the Band. All they must do is submit an application with a copy of their adjudicators form. If they were a member of the MSBOA All State Band, all they must do is follow the instructions above. If they were a member of last year's Lions All State Band, they can be a member of this year's band just by contacting the Lions All State Band Director.

Message from the Immediate Past District Governor

Youth Camps and Exchange Sponsor Lions Clubs

The Sponsor Lions Clubs are the resource for exchange youth to have a close working relationship with their district or multiple district YCE Chairperson. If a Sponsor Club does not have a district or multiple district YCE Chairperson, a Club President will be required to sign for the Exchange Youth along with the district governor, and to work directly with the YCE Chairpersons in the host countries of interest to make all arrangements. The following are general responsibilities for the Sponsor:

- Ensuring that the <u>YCE policy</u> is followed;
- Ensuring compliance with local laws governing youth protection;
- Verifying the exchange youth have sufficient accident, life, personal property, health and liability insurance to cover all contingencies during travel to and from their host country;
- Recruiting, screening and selecting qualified exchange youth;
- Help Exchange Youth use the <u>YCE Directory</u> to find their desired programs;
- Conduct an orientation session for outgoing exchange youth;
- Assist exchange youth with travel arrangements;
- Potentially provide assistance with or full financing for exchange youth travel costs including air fares, insurance, airport service fees, customs duties and any layover or overnight costs in route;
- Maintaining communications between the exchange youth, host Lions club, host family and YCE Chairperson.

How to Become a Sponsor Club!

- Write a press release about the YCE program requesting youth who are interested in the YCE program to contact your club; and
- Contact local schools and universities, especially the foreign language or international studies departments, with information about the YCE program to recruit young people.

It's a summer program for 3-4 weeks depending on the country they select to go. Deadline to submit an application to go abroard will be March 30, 2025.

Departure date, any time from June-July depending on the country they choose.

Youth Camps and Exchange Host Lions Clubs

Host Lions Clubs work closely with the selected youth participants, host families and the district or multiple district YCE Chairperson. If a Host Club does not have a district or multiple district YCE Chairperson, a Club President will be required to sign for the exchange youth along with the district governor, and to work directly with the YCE Chairpersons in the sponsoring country to make all arrangements.

The following are general responsibilities for the host Lions club:

- Ensuring that the YCE policy is followed;
- Ensuring compliance with local laws governing youth protection;
- Verifying the exchange youth have sufficient accident, life, personal property, health and liability insurance to cover all contingencies during travel to and from their host country;
- If your club is hosting an International Camp, your club should do research in case you need to secure separate insurance coverage for the camp itself depending on the activities of the camp;
- Making arrangements for the youth exchange's arrival/departure;
- Recruiting, screening and providing orientation to host families;
- Maintaining communications between the youth participants, Sponsor Lions Club, Host Family and YCE Chairperson; and
- Providing transportation to events organized by your club, including meetings and service projects.

How to Become a Host Club!
